The Blueprint is a combination of designs, configuration guides and security documentation for a secure modern desktop for government and critical infrastructure organisations based on Microsoft 365. The first iteration was launched in March 2020.

Having deployed Microsoft 365 and Microsoft Azure Virtual Desktop (AVD) for thousands of users throughout Australia, across both public and private sectors, we've learned a few things along the way. DTA recently reengaged oobe to maintain the blueprints which saw the oobe team uplift the pattern to include the popular AVD service.
